Dear villagers, team members, family members, and friends;

This letter will serve as an additional update since our previous correspondence. Today we are informing you that one villager and two additional team members have had positive test results returned. Please join me in wishing these individuals well in their recoveries. Due to the laboratory confirmed tests, some households have been placed under quarantine per health department guidelines. The open dates for these areas has been adjusted.

Tentative reopening dates for affected areas are as follows:

Heritage Square First Floor – The Mills plans to reopen on December 10<sup>th</sup>

Heritage Square First Floor – The Manor and The Depot plan to reopen on December 9<sup>th</sup>

As a result of these increased positive cases and out of an abundance of caution, we have added the testing methodology of *broad-based*, where all Brewster Village team members will be tested more frequently, until no new positives are identified. We will continue with contact trace testing as well for all identified individuals at risk of exposure. You will continue to be updated in this manner in the event additional new cases are identified.

Per the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention, Outagamie County remains in the high category for community transmission level. While visitation is not restricted, visitors are encouraged to reschedule their visits to after the quarantine periods are lifted. Additionally, visitors should not visit if they are ill or have been in close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual.

Throughout this prolonged process, all infection prevention measures remain in place, including enhanced cleaning, increased personal protective equipment use, and villager and team member wellness surveillance. I want to publicly thank our team once again for their attention to safety during the pandemic, and our colleagues, family members and the community for the continued encouragement and support.
